LTI BRINGS CUSTOM TELEHEALTH SOLUTIONS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS

The Challenge

Hurricane Michael was the first storm of its magnitude to make landfall on the Northeast Gulf Coast of Florida, causing massive destruction. One year following the storm, the Panhandle region was still devastated, with children being among the most impacted by life stressors, primarily trauma and devastation cause by the Hurricane.

With a healthcare workforce shortage in Florida that was acutely felt in mental health, First Lady Casey DeSantis developed a pilot program in conjunction with the Florida Department of Children & Families (DCF) and Big Bend Community Based Care (now NWF Health Network) to help bridge the gap between children in need and providers ready to treat them.

The Approach

First Lady Case DeSantis launched the Hope for Healing Initiative, which aimed to equip public schools in the Florida Panhandle with a telehealth kiosk in time to start the 2019-2020 academic year. This would enable more than 35,000 school-

aged children to access much-needed mental health care.

"More than 300 children were diagnosed with PTSD and needed access to mental health services. We enabled Florida to provide remote mental health services, attending to 300 kids in less than 30 days who had been on a waiting list for months."

In June 2019, Let's Talk Interactive was tasked by Big Bend Community Based Care (NWF Health Network) to:

- Install 63 custom telehealth kiosks
- Install 63 iPad telehealth portals
- Deploy 100 telehealth provider licenses
- Train the school staff on the technology

All by the start of the school year - a record 42 day turnaround time.

The Results

LTI deployed the telehealth kiosks and portals at the start of the 2019-2020 academic year. This gave



schools and communities the ability to receive mental, acute and emergency care on any device with a cellular or internet connection - putting real-time healthcare at every citizen'sfingertips instantaneously. By delivering muchneeded counseling via school-based kiosks, children were able to remain in schools.

Recently, LTI has expanded its partnership with Amazon Web Services (AWS) by launching their telehealth software services on the AWS Marketplace. It is now easier than ever for healthcare providers both inside and outside the United States to purchase, deploy, and be billed for LTI's telehealth software solutions. <u>Access LTI's telehealth video conference suite in the AWS Marketplace</u> for more details.





The telehealth kiosks facilitated 232 virtual child therapy sessions 15 minutes or greater between October 2019 and March 2020 when COVID hit. As students transitioned to virtual learning, they were able to continue connecting with their mental healthcare provider without leaving their homes, resulting in virtual sessions increasing to 2,532 by June 30, 2020, according to the BBCBC annual report.

As of January 2022, program minutes YTD total 853,044 and program sessions YTD total 17,500.

LTI has recently expanded its program to four additional school districts in the Florida panhandle and others throughout the state of Florida including Orange County Schools schools and Broward county schools.

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
